WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Johnstown has previously submitted applications to the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for funding the Federal Fiscal Year 2016 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Programs; and

WHEREAS, HUD has approved these activities in the approval of the aforementioned applications which were included in the Action Plans of the Consolidated Plan for the Federal Fiscal Year; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) of the City of Johnstown has carried out all project planning and clearance activities including the Environmental Review Record, engineering of the project, advertising and public bidding; and

WHEREAS, DCED carried out all procurement activities which resulted in the receipt of eight bids from which were opened publicly on June 25, 2018 at 2:00PM; and

WHEREAS, the bids were reviewed by DCED staff, with Locher Demolition & Excavating LLC., being identified as the low bonafide bidder with a bid amount of \$173,310.00.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Johnstown, that the City Manager is authorized and directed to sign Contact #2018-07 with Locher Demolition & Excavating, LLC for the completion of demolishing twenty-five (25) structures throughout the City of Johnstown in the amount of \$173,310.00 a per bid on June 25, 2018, with said item to be deducted from Line Item Account No. 0460929018, Department of Demolition, Demolition and Grant Expenses 2018, which maintains a current amount of \$200,000.00.



WHEREAS, the State of Pennsylvania offers low interest loans and grants for successful applicants to complete sewer and water related projects, and

WHEREAS, The City of Johnstown has received a commitment from the Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment Authority for a combination of a grant in the amount of \$6,993,440.00 and a loan in the amount of \$3,906,560.00 in order to complete the necessary improvements to the Inner City Sewer System within the Kernville neighborhood of the City of Johnstown,





A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JOHNSTOWN, PENNSYLVANIA AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY PLANNING COMMISSION TO DEVELOP AND SUBMIT A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN FOR THE CITY.

WHEREAS, the City of Johnstown last comprehensive plan was completed in 1998; and,

WHEREAS, the Johnstown Department of Community and Economic Development provides staffing for planning, elimination of blight, community and economic development needs in the City of Johnstown; and,

WHEREAS, the City has been directed by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to create a new comprehensive plan reflecting its funding priorities and provided financial assistance to that purpose; and,

WHEREAS, the comprehensive provides direction for action as well as setting planning, zoning and development goals, regulations and funding; and,

WHEREAS, the Plan will incorporate work already performed through the Vision 2025 process; and,

WHEREAS, the Plan will address blight mitigation, and market conditions for housing as well as other community needs;
