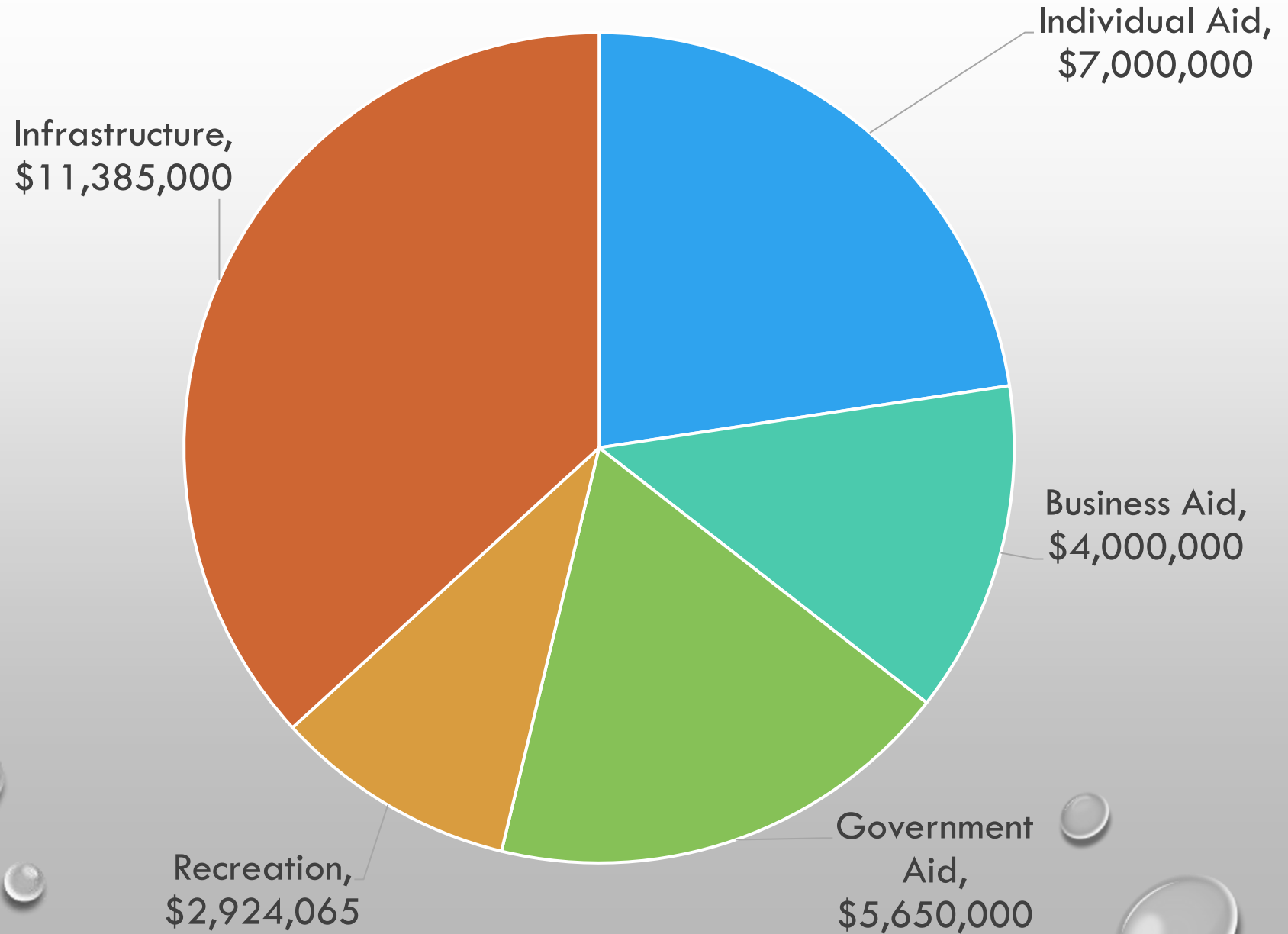

FOOD & CHILDCARE - \$2 million

RELIEF PROGRAM FUNDING FOR RESIDENTS:

- FOOD INSECURITY (\$1 MILLION)
- EARLY LEARNING SERVICES, AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS, CHILDCARE (\$1 MILLION)

REQUIREMENTS

Funds will be distributed as part of an application process to non-profits to provide services.

Funding will be determined on a scoring process of 5 categories:

Sustainability: How will your organization / project continue to operate after grant funds have been awarded?

Impact: How many people does your organization and/or project impact and serve the community, and to what extent?

Readiness: How soon after funds are distributed will your project begin? When do you anticipate your project will complete?

Accessibility: How easy and/or frequently will your organization / project be of use to the general public?

Eligibility: How does your program address the public health crisis caused by COVID-19 as it relates to both the American Rescue Plan Interim Final Rule and American Rescue Plan Final Rule published by the US Department of the Treasury?

SURVIVE

Aid to Businesses & Non Profits - \$2 million

\$25,000 PER BUSINESS OR NON-PROFIT

- PROOF OF LOSS
- PAYROLL OF ESSENTIAL / RETAINED EMPLOYEES
- REIMBURSEMENT OF PANDEMIC RELATED EXPENSES
- RENT / MORTGAGE / UTILITY ASSISTANCE FOR 90 DAYS

REQUIREMENTS

- Must be located within the City of Johnstown
- No outstanding violations with the City
- Must have 500 or fewer employees
- Must not have received any other federal pandemic relief funds
- Documents supporting relief request (payroll, bills, financial statements, tax returns, etc)
