

### City of Johnstown FOWL & LIVESTOCK REGISTRATION APPLICATION

City staff will review these applications and perform site reviews of applicants within 60 days of receiving an application to determine that the livestock and/or fowl being registered with the City adheres to the Livestock and Fowl Policy. Once compliancy with the City's Livestock and Fowl Policy has been determined, the applicant will receive a Permit (good for one year). All applicants must apply annually for this Permit.

The City of Johnstown Community and Economic Development Department reserves the right to issue additional regulations not mentioned above at any time and regulate any other type of animal not listed in the chart above. Additional regulations will be provided to the applicant and the applicant will be provided a set amount of time to achieve compliance.

## **Livestock and Fowl Inspection and Complaint Process**

The City will conduct a minimum of one inspection of an applicant's livestock or fowl area on their property annually. The City may conduct additional inspections in response to complaints filed with the City. If the City requires changes/additions to occur, the applicant must complete those changes/additions within the time period issued by the City.

#### Other Considerations

- Disposal of all livestock and fowl waste must be done in compliance with local and state laws, and requirements by the chosen municipal waste collection agency.
- All livestock and fowl ownership must comply with the City's existing noise ordinance.
- All animals must be current on any required vaccinations. Records must be provided to the City as
- All livestock and fowl must remain on the applicant's property unless utilized for transportation.
- No livestock or fowl may be kept within an apartment without access to the minimum lot size required in
- Slaughtering of any livestock and fowl is prohibited on any residential property.
- This policy does not apply to licensed therapy animals. Proof of license must be provided to the City as requested.
- Animals including dogs, cats, guinea pigs, hamsters, rabbits, weasels, ferrets, chinchillas, mice, rats, reptiles, bees and exotic animals are not regulated under this policy.
- The City, with or without cause, may revoke permission granted through this program. The applicant shall cease the harboring of livestock or fowl within 30 days of revocation or face penalties and legal action from the City.

#### **Grandfather Clause**

The City will provide a grandfather clause for those who own livestock and fowl within the City prior to September 8, 2021. Applicants who request this clause must mark this option on their livestock and fowl application. Under this clause, the City will allow certain aspects of this Livestock and Fowl Policy to be waived. The City will inspect the applicant's livestock or fowl and determine what additional changes/additions the City will require. If additional changes/additions are required, the applicant will have 30 days to implement these changes/additions. If the applicant has a quantity of animals that exceed this Livestock and Fowl policy, the applicant cannot add additional animals unless they fall below the maximum limits outlined within this policy.

# City of Johnstown Community and Economic Development Livestock and Fowl Policy

On September 8, 2021 the City of Johnstown Council voted to approve an amendment to the City's Chapter 614 of the Codified Ordinance titled "Animals". Through this amendment the City added language to regulate livestock and fowl within the City. All residents of the City must register their livestock and fowl with the City of Johnstown Community and Economic Development Department by completing a Livestock and Fowl Application. City staff will review these applications and perform site reviews of applicants within 60 days of receiving an application to determine that the livestock and/or fowl being registered with the City adheres to this Livestock and Fowl Policy. Once compliancy with the City's Livestock and Fowl Policy has been determined, the applicant will receive a Livestock and Fowl Permit good for one year. The applicant must apply annually for their permit. Below is a chart detailing the requirements associated with owning livestock and fowl in the City.
