A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JOHNSTOWN, CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO SIGN ALL DOCUMENTS NECESSARY TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH CJL ENGINEERING FOR DESIGN AND ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR THE MAIN STREET REHABILITATION PROJECT AND CENTRAL PARK IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the City of Johnstown has budgeted funding from its American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Program for design, engineering, and construction of the Central Park Improvements Project; and

WHEREAS, the City of Johnstown has budgeted funding from its Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Grant Program for design, engineering, and construction of the Main Street Rehabilitation Project; and

WHEREAS, the CJL Engineering was previously selected as part of the SCAPE Landscape Architecture design team for the design and engineering of the requested work;

WHEREAS, CJL Engineering will prepare the final bidding documents for the Central Park Improvements Project for \$87,671.00 as described in the CJL Engineering Proposal for the Central Park Improvements Bid Documents; and

WHEREAS, the project is budgeted within the 2025 City ARPA spending plan, line item 28.466.28.568.00.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Johnstown, that the City Manager is authorized and directed to sign all documents and take all actions with CJL Engineering necessary to proceed with the final bidding documents for the Main Street Rehabilitation Project and Central Park Improvements Project, contingent upon the approval of the City Solicitor.
