AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JOHNSTOWN, PENNSYLVANIA,
AMENDING THE CITY OF JOHNSTOWN CODE OF ORDINANCES, PART TEN — STREETS, UTILITIES,
AND PUBLIC SERVICES CODE; TITLE SIX — OTHER PUBLIC SERVICES; CHAPTER 1060 — GARBAGE
AND RUBBISH COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL; AND ORDINANCES 4275 (PASSED 3-6-1982), 5015
(PASSED 12-19-2004), AND 5274 (PASSED 4-17-2019).

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Johnstown, Cambria County, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, that the City of Johnstown Code of Ordinances, Part Ten — Streets, Utilities, and Public Services Code, Title Six — Other Public Services, Chapter 1060 — Garbage and Rubbish Collection and Disposal, is hereby amended as follows:

1060.17 — REFUSE CONTAINERS

(c) Dumpster Containers for Temporary Construction or Property Improvement

1. No person, firm, or utility shall place a dumpster in any public right-of-way or on municipally owned property without first filing an application with the Department of Code Enforcement and obtaining a permit. No permit shall be issued until all application requirements are satisfied.
2. A permit must be obtained and kept on file with the Department of Code Enforcement. The permit must show approval from both the Fire Department and the Public Works Department before the dumpster may be placed.
3. The contractor placing the dumpster must be licensed in the City of Johnstown. The contractor's name, address, and telephone number must be listed on the permit.
4. A copy of the permit must be displayed at the dumpster site.
5. The dumpster must be visible from all sides at night using either lights, reflectors, or fluorescent caution tape.
6. The permit fee is fifty dollars (\$50.00), payable at the time of application.
7. Failure to obtain permit prior to offloading the dumpster shall result in a \$250.00 fine.






